



The Heysen Trail

- The Heysen Trail comes near Victor Harbor after nearly 1100km of travelling from the Flinders Ranges.
- The trail comes down through Newland Hill.
- Then passes through a road reserve, which contains a dense growth of remnant vegetation.
- After leaving the road reserve the trail goes down the road towards Victor Harbor.
- It then turns right onto King Beach Road. King Head represents the North-South part of the trail.
- The trail then goes West along the coast to Newland Head, which is a Conservation Park not far from Victor Harbor.
- If planning a walk along the Heysen Trail from Victor Harbor there is a carpark at the end of King Head Road.
- From Kings Head to Newland Head it is approximately 10 km or 20 km return.
- Along the trail are the red and white markers to show the way. Don't go of the tracks.
- If you are planning a long walk tell somebody about when and where you're going and how long it's going to take approximately. In case something goes wrong.
